Independence Day

Celebrate the 4th of July at the home of author Washington Irving. Visit the Revolutionary War monument at Sleepy Hollow Cemetery and more than 70 veterans of the revolution buried nearby in the Old Dutch Burying Ground.

August

Hazy, hot, and humid

Cool off with a show at the Tarrytown Music Hall or a concert at a waterfront park. Head up to Stone Barns to learn how traditions of community-based farming are being melded with 21st century sustainable farming techniques.

September

Summer isn't over yet

The first crisp days of the year are still a few weeks off, so enjoy a stroll in Rockefeller State Park or a meal overlooking the Hudson River. Take a night photography class at Sleepy Hollow Cemetery.

LEGENDS LIVE IN SLEEPY HOLLOW

Nearly two hundred years ago Washington Irving dubbed the valley of the Pocantico River "Sleepy Hollow" and wrote wistfully of it: "If ever I should wish for a retreat whither I might steal from the world and its distractions, and dream quietly away the remnant of a troubled life, I know of none more promising than this little valley."

Despite 200 years that transformed this sleepy farming community into a modern suburb, it's still possible to pick out the locations of major landmarks from the story—with two major exceptions: the bridge upon which Ichabod Crane lost his race with

the Headless Horseman and the Sleepy Hollow schoolhouse have been lost to the ravages of time. Find directions for tracing Ichabod Crane's famous ride here: <http://sleepyhollowcemetery.org/sleepy-hollow-country/>

Frederick Philipse's 17th Century mill still stands, as does the original Dutch Reformed Church. Most surprisingly, the valley of the Pocantico River itself has been largely spared from development by Sleepy Hollow Cemetery and several generations of the Rockefeller family. As in Irving's day, "A drowsy, dreamy influence seems to hang over the land, and to pervade the very atmosphere."

There's something for everyone in Sleepy Hollow: haunted hayrides, gothic mansions . . .

There's lots to do and see in Sleepy Hollow and Tarrytown year round, and the weekends prior to Halloween are packed with events that tie in to "The Legend of Sleepy Hollow." If possible, make advanced reservations as most events fill quickly. To avoid disappointment, call ahead to confirm dates and times. Some events require reservations or advance tickets.

Old Dutch Church of Sleepy Hollow and Old Dutch Burying Ground, 430 North Broadway, Sleepy Hollow, NY 10591, www.odcfriends.com, 914-631-4497. This churchyard is the spot where Ichabod Crane sought

sanctuary from the Headless Horseman in Washington Irving's short story "The Legend of Sleepy Hollow." The church has been in continuous use since around 1690 except for a few years during the American Revolution. Tours of the church from June through the end of October, Saturdays and Sundays from noon to 4:00 PM. New in 2010: Apple iPad tours! In "The Legend of Sleepy Hollow," Ichabod Crane saunters beside the manor's millpond with the "country damsels" of the

neighborhood. This is also the departure point for tours of Kykuit.

Kykuit, the Rockefeller mansion in the hamlet of Pocantico Hills on the outskirts of Sleepy Hollow. Guided tours of the house and its gardens and art galleries are available through Historic Hudson Valley. Open mid May through the beginning of November, weekdays 10AM-3PM, weekends 10AM-4PM, closed Tuesdays. Stained glass windows by Henri Matisse and Marc Chagall at Union Church of Pocantico Hills, 555 Bedford Road, Pocantico Hills (Sleepy Hollow), 914-631-8200 (tour info), 914-631-2069 (info on church services), www.hudsonvalley.org. André Captor’s Monument, North Broadway, Tarrytown, NY 10591. Revolutionary War site. A monument marks the spot where three Americans captured British spy John André and exposed Benedict Arnold’s treasonous plot to turn over West Point to the British. In “The Legend of Sleepy Hollow” this is the spot where Ichabod Crane first encounters the Headless Horseman.

acre peninsula juts into the Hudson River about 8 miles north of Sleepy Hollow. The park offers cabins, RV sites, and tent sites. The cabin area can be raucous, but the views of the Hudson River are spectacular. Enjoy the sandy beach, launch a boat (sailboards, canoes, kayaks, and car-top carried boats only), or fish off the rocky point. The park is also a popular spot for bird watchers, with frequent sightings of bald eagles and several species of hawks. Tent sites start at \$25/night, RV sites at \$30/night, cabins at \$205/night. Discounts apply for holders of Westchester County parks pass.

Harriman State Park, in Rockland and Orange counties, is the second-largest park in the New York state parks system, with 31 lakes and reservoirs, 200 miles of hiking trails, three beaches, public camping areas, and miles of streams and scenic roads. At over 44,000 acres, this is as close to wilderness as you can find near New York City. About 25 miles from Sleepy Hollow, across the Tappan Zee Bridge (\$5 toll). Beaver Pond Campgrounds offers tent and RV sites. Reserve through Reserve America at 1-800-456-CAMP, 1-800-456-2267, <http://nysparks.state.ny.us>.

Ward Pound Ridge Reservation, Route 121 South (near intersection with Route 35), Cross River, NY, 10518, 914-864-7317 or 914-864-7318, <http://parks.westchestergov.com/>. 4,300 acre park about 25 miles from Sleepy Hollow offers picnicking, year-round lean-to and tent camping, equestrian trails, hiking, fishing (trout stream), and cross-country skiing. Tent sites are \$25/night, lean-tos \$35/night. Those rates are discounted to \$15 and \$25, respectively, with a Westchester County parks pass.
